- 4. **Join us for Worship this Sunday, February 14**<sup>th</sup> **when** we will "bury" our "Alleluias!" together during the Story for All Ages <u>OR</u> "bury" your "Alleluia!" at another time that day if you can't join in on worship.
- 5. **Keep your "Alleluias!" buried until Easter Sunday** when we will "unbury" them together.
